

European healthcare professionals unite for the future of vaccination

On 17 January, nearly 100 experts from across Europe gathered to discuss European and national vaccination policies and healthcare professionals' role in increasing vaccine confidence and uptake.

The Coalition for Vaccination conference brought together healthcare professionals, students, policymakers, civil society, researchers, and the general public.

The [Council Conclusions](#) adopted under the Czech presidency of the EU in December, reaffirmed that vaccination is one of the most effective tools in the prevention of infectious diseases, highlighted the importance of communication training for healthcare professionals and reinforced the role of the Coalition.

Conference participants, including representatives from the European Commission, WHO/Europe and the Permanent Representation of the Czech Republic, stressed the need for us to work together to close vaccination gaps.

Over the past two years, the EU co-funded IMMUNION project has supported the Coalition by developing education and training resources for healthcare professionals, advocacy materials and campaigns on vaccination, as well as tools for national authorities to help increase vaccine uptake, with a focus on Italy, Greece, Latvia and Romania. As the IMMUNION project wraps up its final deliverables, the Coalition for Vaccination will continue to advance collaboration between healthcare professionals.

Stefan Schreck (DG SANTE, European Commission) said "Healthcare professionals are trusted sources of information on vaccination for many people. They can also be role models for other health professionals, by getting vaccinated themselves."

It was convened by the European Commission in 2019 with an aim to support delivering accurate information to the public, combating myths around vaccines and vaccination, and exchanging best practices on vaccination.

IMMUNION ("Improving IMMunisation cooperation in the European UNION") is an EU co-funded project which strengthens collaboration between healthcare professionals and other stakeholders to communicate evidence-based information about vaccination and increase vaccine confidence and uptake.
